A small group of hospitals and non-profit neighborhood health centers guided by their mission to assure healthcare accessibility to all regardless of ability to pay are under contract with the City of Kansas City and funded by the Health Levy to provide medical and public healthcare.

Who is eligible?

You must be a verified Kansas City, Missouri resident in the last 365 days. And, you must have income that falls under 400% of the Federal Poverty Level.

What services can be covered by Health Levy?

Medical, Dental, Vision, Mental Health, Behavioral Health and Maternal Health

What is a Safety Net Provider?

A small group of hospitals and non-profit neighborhood health centers guided by their mission to assure healthcare accessibility to all regardless of ability to pay are under contract with the City of Kansas City for medical and public healthcare.

Can my organization get Health Levy funding?

Only Safety Net Providers (SNP) in Kansas City, Missouri, are eligible for Health Levy funding.

Individuals cannot receive Health Levy funding.

The City is contracted with six Safety Net Providers:



- Children's Mercy Hospital
- KC Care Health Center
- Northland Health Care Access
- Samuel U. Rogers Health Center
- Swope Health
- University Health

Can I use the Health Levy if I live in KCK?

Only verified Kansas City, Missouri residents are eligible for Health Levy funding.

Do the Health Levy funds cover my entire visit?

The Health Levy funding is solely intended to provide financial assistance to external Safety Net Providers. SNPs are required to notify Health Levy-eligible patients or clients that the City of Kansas City may fund some or part of their care. It cannot be used for any other purpose.

Can I receive a check from the City for Health Levy funding?

Each contracted SNP receives a monthly payment allocation for serving the eligible uninsured and underinsured residents of Kansas City, Missouri.
